DAN JONES

Composer

Dan Jones is a multi award-winning composer and sound designer working in film, television and theatre. Recent credits include the BBC's hugely successful primetime series *World on Fire*, the film adaptation of Ian McEwan's novel *On Chesil Beach*, starring Saoirse Ronan, Louis Theroux's documentary feature, *My Scientology Movie*, and the primetime BBC drama series *SS-GB* and *The Miniaturist* (for which Dan won his third Ivor Novello Award). Other notable film credits include *Shadow of the Vampire*, starring John Malkovich and Willem Dafoe, which received two Oscar nominations (Dan himself being long-listed by *Variety* as an Oscar contender for his score); *The Tonto Woman*, also nominated for an Oscar in the short films category; and *Max*, starring John Cusack and Noah Taylor, for which Dan won his first Ivor Novello award. For Channel 4/Carnival's *Any Human Heart* Dan won BAFTA and Ivor Novello awards as well as gaining double Emmy nominations. In the realm of the theatre, in 2011 Dan received the Special Jury Prize for Excellence in Sound Design, at the Prague Quadrennial awards for his work on the acclaimed production *Kursk*.

Dan's work is notable for its range as much as its quality. The luxuriant romanticism and gorgeous melodies of his scores for *Any Human Heart, Man in an Orange Shirt, Max* and *A Matador's Mistress* (starring Penelope Cruz and Adrien Brody) contrast with the ambient minimalism used in *Criminal Justice* and *Dead Set*. He is equally at home writing for the orchestra, as in his epic score for Sir David Attenborough's 10-part *The Life of Mammals*, and for electronics - often in a highly experimental way. As well as working extensively in the theatre, not least as co-director of The Sound and Fury Theatre Company, Dan is also acclaimed for his work on art installations, such as *Suburban Counterpoint: Music for Seven Ice-Cream Vans* (London and Norwich), *Sky Orchestra* (Bristol, Birmingham, Stratford-upon-Avon, Sydney and London 2011), and *The Moon Exhibition* (Natural History Museum, London).

Dan read music at Oxford University where he graduated with first class honours. He received the Ralph Vaughan Williams Electro-Acoustic Scholarship 1995 which he spent at the Centro Richerche Musicali in Rome, and has also studied contemporary music theatre at the Banff Centre for the Arts.
